

<u>CARE AND FEEDING OF YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM</u> (Reprint) BY: Mike Moyer If you have a newer tank, **clean the filter** - hose it off <u>once a year</u> in summer to maintain the flow through the septic system.

Follow <u>all</u> steps below with faithful discipline to keep your septic system healthy or a long time. My neighborhood uses Walt Steuer Pumping which sells monthly DIY root killer and enzyme packets. Phone 231-946-2462 <u>FIVE MUST - DO ACTIONS</u> - 1. Keep out trees & roots - 2. Don't kill the 'bugs' - 3. Keep the 'bugs' healthy - 4. Clean the filter if present. 5. Pump out every 5 to 8 years

Prior approval was rescinded in Milton Township citing concerns over economic impact, maintenance and proximity to orchards. There is a worry that bicyclers leaving the trail may trespass on

orchards leading to liability for growers. Antrim Board of Commissioners has postponed consideration until concerns are addressed. 
DNR – NW MICHIGAN FISHING REPORT Week of Thursday June 15

Charlevoix: Boats can still catch the occasional lake herring outside of the channel and over to North Point when trolling or jigging spoons and blade baits. Lake Trout have moved out and were caught 50 feet down in 250 to 300 feet. Smallmouth were caught in the channel but most were sub-legal.

Traverse City: Lake trout regulations for both the East and West Bay have changed. It is now 2 fish and a 15 inch minimum. *Lake trout and some big lake herring were caught in the East Bay off Elk Rapids. The Elk River is producing smallmouth bass in all sizes. Anglers were using minnows, leeches and tube baits. Bass were caught in the shallows at the south end of the Bay. http://www.michigan.gov/dnr/0,4570,7-153-10364-34956--,00.html#NWLP*

ELK RAPIDS HARBOR IMPROVEMENTS

Of interest to all GT Bay boaters –TowBoatUS is in the harbor full time in a slip near the ramp. This will be a great service to you and our many launch ramp users who may need assistance. TowBoatUS will be providing information soon on services and costs.

The harbor channel was dredged to about 12 feet in the middle for less grounding. Aspen Wireless installed a new WIFI system throughout the harbor to allow a large number of devices to connect at higher speeds.

<u>Of interest to Seasonal slip holders</u> - I am also pleased to inform you that all seasonal slips had electricity in mid-May. These are very nice pedestals with each plug has a ground fault breaker that will trip at 30 milliamps. This will reduce or eliminate the possibility of electric shock drowning in the water. The harbor also has a "No Swimming Rule" to prevent electric shock.

Many other improvements this season, hopefully you will enjoy them all. Please drop suggestions in our box in the dayroom or let the harbor office know. Here is a list of improvements: Air conditioning in the bathhouse and day room. Drinking fountains have been replaced with new bottle fill stations inside. These have filters on them and water tastes great. So fill your water bottles in the bathhouse - New dock carts for you to use which will be under the gazebo as usual - New wall art in the bathhouse to make things more inviting. - Automatic Electronic Defibrillator on the wall near the picnic table/grills area to assist with any health emergencies - We have all new grills at the picnic area - Replaced permanent gas grills at the pavilion with new grills similar to the dock grilling area.
