TNN Forecasts Three Townships spent \$2.75 million for FY 2013-14 Overhead of 39% is excessive for elected officials' compensation, general administration and taxation. Elk Rapids Township is best at 34% overhead

Elected officials' compensation is the most expensive component Milton pay/benefits are by far the most costly, contributing to its highest overhead at 49% of spending. Yet salaries were increased in FY 2013-14.

Spending priorities have properly shifted to Public Safety & Service
This is especially true in Elk Rapids Township where 66% is spent on public service, principally for EMS. Milton is notable for roads and fire and is applauded for leveraging Elk Rapids Township EMS services.

This Fiscal Comparison aims to enable data-driven decisions.

Townships measure dollar <u>inputs</u> not quality of service performed. Public financial policy should measure <u>outputs</u> per unit of cost based on performance metrics to directly benefit taxpayers without cutting services.

<u>How This Study Was Done</u>: Elk Rapids and Torch lake Townships supplied 9 months of spending data in electronic form (Excel) ready for consolidation into this report. Milton data was obtained from paper reports available at monthly Township meetings. <u>Quick Books</u> software used by ER Township and <u>BSA</u> used by TL Township (and Antrim assessors) facilitates comparison to inform the public. The 12 month TNN Forecast, projected from 9 months of data, will differ from March Townships' Annual Meetings 12 month actuals.
